A SALUTE TO TIMOTHY F. HAGAN

Public service is a hallmark of Tim Hagan's career. When he was elected Cuyahoga County Commissioner in 1982, he became the 100th person to serve as a Cuyahoga County Commissioner and serves today as the Commission President. Hagan was re-elected to his fourth four year term as County Commissioner.

Hagan served as Cuyahoga County Recorder in 1982 and as Chairman of the Cuyahoga County Democratic Party for four years. He also has worked as an assistant to the administrator of the County Grand Jury, the Cuyahoga County Nutrition Program for the Elderly, and as the Governmental Liaison for the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority.

Hagan served with the NATO forces in Europe and was honorably discharged from the United States Army in 1968. He is a 1975 graduate of the Maxine Goodman Levin College of Urban Affairs at Cleveland State University.

Throughout his career as a public servant, Hagan has been especially concerned with improving services to the poor, the powerless, the elderly and the children. His focus has been on such areas as foster care, adoption and general health and human services issues. Hagan is Chair of the County Welfare Reform Council and led the successful Health and Human Services levy campaigns.

Hagan serves as a trustee of the Malachi House hospice; Youth Opportunities Unlimited; the Greater Cleveland International Trade Alliance; NOACA (Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency); and is a lifetime member of the NAACP. He also served as a member of the national board of the Robert F. Kennedy Foundation. He serves as a consultant for the Mandel Foundation.

Hagan is the father of Eleanor and Marie.
