Voter Information for Cleveland State University from the Office of Civic Engagement

REGISTER TO VOTE

To be eligible to vote you must be...

☑ Registered to vote 30 days before an election

A U.S. citizen

√ 18+ years old (by the General Election)

Confirm, update, or register to vote at: www.voteohio.gov

VOTING BY MAIL

Receive your ballot on campus - no need to travel home!

Send a completed absentee ballot application to your county Board of Elections. Return your ballot by U.S. Mail ASAP OR deliver it in person to your county BOE prior to the close of the polls on Election Day. If you vote in person after requesting a vote by mail ballot, your ballot will be a provisional one and will be counted.

EARLY VOTING

ELECTION DAY FAQs

What Do I Bring on Election Day?

Valid forms of voter ID include: An unexpired Ohio Driver's License or Ohio ID card, Military ID, or Passport.

What Are Election Day Voting Hours?

Polls are open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. If you are in line when the polls close, stay in line! You have the right to vote.

I Live On Campus - Where Do I Vote?

Fenn Tower, The Langston, The Edge, and Euclid Commons residents vote at the Urban League of Greater Cleveland, 2930 Prospect Ave. E, Cleveland, OH 44115. It's .5 miles away and an 11-minute walk from campus.

Election Protection is a nonpartisan coalition providing a toll-free hotline for voting information and to report problems at 1-866-OUR-VOTE and https://866ourvote.org. If you make a mistake on your ballot, ask for a new one.
